*ASB is not defined as 'crime' however it has been included in this table for your information as it can affect the wider community and we (police) are jointly responsible with local councils for dealing with it. Recordable ASB includes neighbour disputes, noise nuisance and fly tipping etc.

The figure now provided includes all ASB – environmental, nuisance and personal.

Please note that there has been a change in the way burglary offences are recorded nationally. They are now classified as:

Burglary Residential – all buildings within the boundaries of a property, including sheds and garages

Burglary Business and Community – buildings that are solely for business purposes or are otherwise outside the classification of residential burglary, such as a sports club or place of worship.

Other News and events

There was a Theft of a Bronze type statue from a garden in the village.

Three men were caught hare coursing near to Standon. They were all charged with relevant offences and the vehicle and dogs were also seized. In a separate incident we stopped nine people acting suspiciously near to Hunsdon, disrupting any potential illegal activity.

East Herts has also seen an increase in burglaries, several of which have taken place in rural areas, in daylight hours. Entry has been gained at the rear of properties usually by breaking a window or forcing patio doors.

Shed breaks have also increased so make sure that your outbuildings are locked and secured with robust padlocks and there has been an increase in theft from vans. Please be vigilant and remove all property from vehicles when parked at night.
